

Information for Authors

The Editors and Publisher of *The American Journal of Surgery* invite concise original articles in the fields of clinical and experimental surgery as well as:

- Descriptions of modern operative techniques ("How I Do It")
- Review articles
- Surgical pharmacology articles
- Brief reports, which must be limited to 7 typed double-spaced pages including the title page. No more than 3 tables, illustrations, or combination thereof will be considered. References must be limited to 10 or fewer. An abstract and a short 2- to 4-sentence summary for the table of contents should be included on separate pages. Subheadings within the text, such as Materials and Methods, Results, and Comments, should not be used. Longer brief reports will be returned without review.
- No case reports in any of these categories will be accepted.

Statements in articles are the responsibility of the authors. Articles must be contributed solely to *The American Journal of Surgery* and become the property of the Publisher. The Publisher reserves copyright and renewal on all published material, and such material may not be reproduced in any form without the written permission of the Publisher.

Any financial support should be acknowledged. Furthermore, all editorial reviewers will be reminded of potential conflicts of interest on their part, financial and otherwise. If such a conflict is recognized, the reviewer will be excused from the manuscript's review and another assigned.

Manuscripts should be typed double-space on 8½ × 11" white bond paper with 1-inch margins. Manuscripts should not exceed 20 pages, excluding simple tables. There should be no more than 40 references. Review articles should contain no more than 100 references.

Affiliated organizations should limit the pages of their manuscripts to a maximum of 12 to 15, excluding simple tables and figures, to avoid page charges. No more than 5 tables, figures, or combination thereof will be considered. There should be no more than 40 references.

No extra pages may be purchased by individual authors. In specific cases, the Editor may permit affiliated organizations to purchase extra pages for the sole purpose of full and complete publication of their transactions, including edited discussions.

All manuscripts should meet the requirements listed on this page. Refer to the Submission Checklist before submitting a manuscript. Acronyms and abbreviations should not be used within the text, other than those for units of measure. Generic names of drugs should be used; the brand name may be included in parentheses at first mention if desired. Tenths of percentages should be rounded off to whole numbers. No reference to individual patients will be permitted (i.e., patients 1, 2, 3, etc., or 45-year-old man, etc.).

Figures: Only illustrations that increase the understanding of the text should be submitted. Three sets of glossy photographs should be provided. They must be glossy prints in sharp focus, they should not be mounted, and all printing must be done by a professional artist. Make decimals, broken lines, and lettering strong enough for reproduction. Computer-generated figures will not be considered. Radiographs must be of high quality to reproduce adequately. Color reproduction is not recommended, and the cost must be paid by the author if color illustrations are accepted.

Attach a label to the back of each figure indicating the number of the figure, the author's name, the title of the paper, and the top of the figure. All figures must be mentioned in the text in consecutive order. Illustrations in published articles will not be returned. The Publisher allows a limited sum toward illustration reproduction. The Editor reserves the right to limit the number of illustrations.

Legends must be typed on a separate sheet rather than attached to figures. Legends for photomicrographs should indicate the magnification and the method of staining.

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Tables should supplement rather than duplicate the text. Tables that repeat information in the text will be omitted. Each table should have a title and be typed double-space without horizontal or vertical lines on 8½ × 11" paper. Tables should be numbered consecutively with Roman numerals in the order of first mention in the text. Provide a footnote to each table, identifying all abbreviations used.

References must follow the general arrangement and punctuation outlined in: International Committee of Medical Editors. Uniform requirements for manuscripts submitted to biomedical journals. *Ann Intern Med* 1988; 108: 258-65 or *Br Med J* 1988; 296 (6619): 401-5. They should be typed double-space on a separate sheet in the numeric order in which they are first mentioned in the text. Only references that are mentioned in the text should be listed. Use the *Index Medicus* style for abbreviations of journal titles. List all authors if there are six or fewer; for seven or more authors, list the first three and add *et al.*

Journal articles: Spertini P, Wauters JP, Poulenas I. Carpal tunnel syndrome: a frequent, invalidating, long-term complication of chronic hemodialysis. *Clin Nephrol* 1984; 21: 98-101.

Books: Rubio PA, Farrell EM. Atlas of angioaccess surgery. Chicago: Year Book Medical Publishers, 1983: 238-45.

Chapters in books: Malone JM, Goldstone J. Lower extremity amputation. In: Moore WS, ed. Vascular surgery: a comprehensive review. New York: Grune & Stratton, 1986: 1139-208.

For references to articles in press, supply the name of the journal and, if available, the volume number and year. References to unpublished material, including written (not verbal) personal communications, should be included parenthetically in the text.

Acknowledgements: Footnotes of acknowledgement to individuals for help received are not used for publication. Such acknowledgement should be made directly to the individual involved or, if the contribution warrants, the person should be made a co-author.

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Manuscript Submission and Books for Review: Manuscripts and books for possible review should be sent to Hiram C. Polk, Jr., MD, Department of Surgery, University of Louisville, Louisville, KY 40292.

Submission Checklist:

- 3 to 6 key words for indexing are listed on a separate page.
- Manuscript contains a 150-word abstract on a separate page.
- Manuscript contains a 2- to 3-sentence summary to appear in the table of contents.
- References are listed in order of appearance in the text, and the appropriate numbers are inserted in the text in brackets at the proper places.
- Tables are numbered consecutively with Roman numerals.
- Figures are mentioned in the text in consecutive order. The corresponding legends should be typed on a separate page.
- The title page includes the first and last names of all authors, highest academic degrees, the name of the department and institution from which the work originated, and the name and address of the author to whom reprint requests should be addressed.
- Submit original and three copies of all elements to the Editor at the above address. Each set is arranged in this order: (1) title page, (2) abstract, (3) text, (4) references, (5) tables, (6) legends, (7) figures.
